HEALEY ALS Platform Trial

The HEALEY ALS Platform Trial is a multicenter, double-blind, placebo-controlled, perpetual, adaptive platform trial testing multiple investigational products in parallel.

Results of first five investigational products have been announced. Two of the first five have positive results on secondary outcome measures and are proceeding to next steps for drug

development (CNM-AU8, Clene Nanomedicine and pridopidine, Prilenia). For both of these investigational products, the National Institute of Health recently funded expanded access programs (see below).

Massachusetts ALS Advocacy Day On Thursday, May 2, Sabrina Paganoni, M.D., Ph.D., spoke at the State House as part of the first ever Massachusetts ALS Advocacy Day. The event was attended by patients and their families, ALS advocates and Healey & AMG Center staff. Dr. Paganoni spoke about the progress being made in the clinical and research spaces around ALS, as well as encouraging legislative support for ALS treatment.

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Combination Therapy Showed Favorable Safety Profile in ALS

Merit Cudkowicz, M.D., M.Sc. discussed the combination therapy of ciprofloxacin and celecoxib (Prime C, NeuroSense) demonstrating a favorable safety profile for those with ALS. "The combination treatment was safe, the discontinuation rates were similar between the groups and the side effects were rare, often mild and did not lead to drug discontinuation."

Ride to Endure

After caring for his uncle who had ALS, Miron Golfman an ultra-endurance athlete, was motivated to raise awareness and funds for ALS by taking on extreme physical challenges in honor of those who can't. The Ride to Endure film follows Miron's journey along the 1,600-mile Baja Divide route in Mexico to raise funds and awareness for the ALS community. Since the Baja Divide attempt in January of 2022, Miron has cycled the 1,000-mile Iditarod Trail in Alaska in March 2023 & 2024 raising funds for the Sean M. Healey & AMG Center at Mass General. 
Ice Bucket Challenge 10th Anniversary
