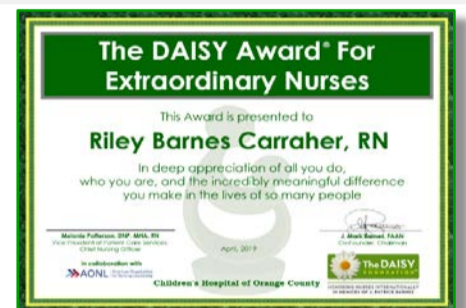


Healer's Touch Sculpture
