Stephen A. Kennedy, MD, FRCS, FAOA, is the Residency Program Director and Associate Professor in the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery and Sports Medicine at the University of Washington School of Medicine. He completed his Doctor of Medicine and Orthopaedic Surgery Residency at the University of British Columbia, followed by fellowships in Hand & Microvascular Surgery at the University of Washington and in Sports Medicine and Upper Extremity Surgery at the University of Manitoba.

Since joining the University of Washington faculty in 2013, Dr. Kennedy has served as an attending physician at Harborview Medical Center and the University of Washington Medical Center. These institutions serve as tertiary and quaternary care centers for the 5-state WWAMI region, which includes Washington, Wyoming, Alaska, Montana, and Idaho. Harborview Medical Center is the only Level 1 trauma center in the region. Dr. Kennedy also holds an adjunct appointment in the Department of Surgery's division of Plastic Surgery.

In addition to his clinical duties, Dr. Kennedy plays a key role in medical education, currently serving as the Residency Program Director for the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery & Sports Medicine. He supervises 40 orthopaedic residents annually and is involved in the education of four Hand & Microvascular fellows, Plastic Surgery residents, and medical students.

Dr. Kennedy's commitment to teaching has earned him numerous accolades, including the UW Medicine Cares Award, the All-Resident Teaching Award, and the Chief Resident Teaching Award. He is an active member of several prestigious professional organizations, including the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons, the American Society for Surgery of the Hand, and the American Orthopaedic Association. His research, which focuses on hand surgery, orthopaedic education, and complex upper extremity injuries and infections, is widely published in peer-reviewed journals.

With a deep commitment to medical education, research, and patient care, Dr. Kennedy continues to shape clinical practice and inspire the next generation of orthopaedic surgeons.
